

Clarence Valley was forecast to grow by around 18% from 2021 to 2041


We surveyed n=526 residents in October to November 2024.

The data was collected using a combination of Social Media Advertising and via Clarence Valley Council's own channels.


Controls were employed to ensure minimum representation from key groups of interest spatially and demographically.


A data-normalisation and weighting procedure was applied to ensure the survey sample reflected population characteristics.





Four local areas...






INSIGHT 1: What is Driving Overall Liveability?

Clarence Valley achieves an Overall Liveability Index (OLI) of 61.2, outperforming Northern NSW benchmarks but falling short of the Australian average.




INSIGHT 1: What is Driving Overall Liveability?

Liveability strengths of the region are the natural amenity, safety and sense of community




INSIGHT 1: What is Driving Overall Liveability?

'A sense of community' is highly important to Clarence Valley residents, and more positively experienced than other parts of Australia
















The community were more likely to have prepared for bushfires than for floods

For renters, affordable decent housing is the number one thing contributing to their quality of life



"Looking into the rental market. We either need to regulate the overuse of short stay rentals (e.g. Airbnb) to open up more rental opportunities or build more affordable housing."


Experiences of renters' ability to access affordable decent housing are lower...

The Clarence Valley community is diverse, and there are some clear generational and spatial differences in values and experiences



Younger and older residents have distinct priorities and perceptions regarding liveability

Low liveability perceptions: 59.4

Values:

- Access to the natural environment
- Affordable decent housing
- Good job prospects

Poorer mental health and social wellbeing, financial circumstances and hold stronger belief in and views regarding climate change and mitigation.





Report better levels of mental health, social wellbeing and financial circumstances. Hold slightly lower belief in climate change.


Within Clarence Valley, there are lower perceptions of liveability in urban areas



In Area A (Grafton and surrounds), natural amenity and a sense of safety and community are limiting liveability



In Area D (Yamba and surrounds), perceived experiences with health services and road congestion are limiting liveability



Clarence Valley's Views In summary...

Maintaining the liveability of local areas is essential to retaining residents, attracting workers and businesses to the area, and for a strong local tourism market. The results of the survey indicate that the Clarence Valley region has many strengths, including a high level of natural amenity and a strong sense of community. However, there is an opportunity for further policy and advocacy directed at advancing quality of life for the attributes of relatively high importance, but poorer local area experiences, including high quality health services and affordable decent housing.


