



What do we already know about the Huon Valley? Informed by our understanding of local area demographics and economics...



Over the past ten years, the population grew at a faster rate than Tasmania on average

Higher proportion of older couples without children (14% vs 10% across Australia)


Higher proportion of home owners without a mortgage (42% vs 36% across Tasmania)

How many people were surveyed?

We surveyed n=1,246 residents in April and May 2025.


The data was collected using a combination of Social Media Advertising (41% of sample) and via Huon Valley Council's own channels (58% of sample).

Controls were employed to ensure minimum representation from key groups of interest spatially and demographically.

A data-normalisation and weighting procedure was applied to ensure the survey sample reflected population characteristics.

This is the second wave of the project, with the first wave conducted in 2021.






The final data has been weighted to reflect the population distribution in Huon Valley.



What does this mean for overall liveability?


The combination of values and experiences gives the Huon Valley an Overall Liveability Index of 55.5/100. This is informed by residents' experiences of the things they value most.

Liveability differed subtly by local area




'High quality health services' Importance (%) and experience (0-10 average) scores








